- EXPLORE Act Passes House Natural Resources Committee: The Expanding Public Lands Outdoor Recreation Experiences (EXPLORE) Act passed the House Natural Resources Committee by unanimous consent on January 17. The EXPLORE Act is the first-ever outdoor recreation-specific bill package and does not cost taxpayer dollars. It will boost local and national economies, give more Americans—especially those in underserved areas—greater access to green spaces and public lands and waters, while also modernizing policies and procedures to support the recreation businesses that connect people to outdoor experiences.
