


The Latest South Mountain Partnership News



You Can Build Capacity With DCNR's Partnership Grants

South Mountain Partnership is interested in advancing regional recreation and conservation efforts with DCNR's Peer and Circuit Rider Partnership Grants. These grants provide flexible, year-round funding to address small-scale needs in local communities. The Peer Program helps municipalities hire consultants for specialized projects like improving park services or forming intergovernmental agencies. The Circuit Rider Program funds full-time

professionals to initiate new programs for counties or regional entities. These grants aim to build local capacity to better manage resources and meet conservation needs.

• Franklin County Stream Team - Information Session and Training Workshop

Franklin County Conservation District is partnering with the Alliance for Aquatic Resource Monitoring (ALLARM) to create a Stream Team. The Stream Team will consist of volunteers who will conduct chemical and biological stream monitoring. This includes water temperature, conductivity, nitrate-nitrogen, pH, stage and water clarity, and conduct biological (macroinvertebrate) and visual assessments of their assigned streams.
