SMP Research Grants Open

Funding applications to the 2025 South Mountain Research Corps Grants are now open! NEW this year we have three rolling deadlines. We hope this will make the program work well with a variety of timing for you and your students. The South Mountain Research Corps (SMRC) seeks to support academic and student-focused research in environmental sciences, forestry, agriculture, cultural and historic resources, geology, geography, and land use planning within the South Mountain region of Adams, Cumberland, Franklin, and York counties in south central Pennsylvania.

PA Announces \$1.7 Million Investment in South Mountain Landscape!

On November 12, Governor Josh Shapiro and Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DNCR) Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn announced \$79.4 million in grants for 307 projects across Pennsylvania, aimed at expanding recreational opportunities, conserving natural spaces, and revitalizing communities. These grants will support a wide range of projects, including improving local parks, expanding trails and river access points, and creating more green space in local communities. We are excited \$1.7 million of that investment occurs within the South Mountain Region.

Wittlinger Fall Planting 2024 Flex Grant Spotlight



The Wittlinger Nature Preserve, located in Boiling Springs, Pennsylvania, is a gem of a natural area but is currently overrun with invasive plants. Our South Mountain Partnership Flex Grant funded a Fall Planting which endeavors to restore the preserve's ecosystem by removing invasive plants and replacing them with native species. This restoration effort will improve the habitat for numerous animals as well as build awareness in the community of the interconnectedness of our community and the Chesapeake Bay Watershed. As the nature preserve noted "This grant has been helpful in providing the funds to purchase materials and tools that we would not otherwise have been able to buy." We are proud of the hard work these volunteers undertook as a part of our Flex Grant!
